The Airway Revolution Foundation has partnered with Columbia University to transform dental and medical education to ensure that future dentists and physicians are trained to understand risk factors, diagnose, collaborate, and treat airway disorders.

As part of our mission, a documentary series will create awareness, provide education, and inspire action about the global airway disorder epidemic and its impact on disease and our greatest, modern, chronic health issues. The documentary will contribute to our grassroots movement to inform congress of this epidemic, and inspire an allocation of significant research dollars for University and private Airway disorder research.

In addition, the partnership will develop a Columbia University Center of Excellence for airway disorder research and collaborative airway diagnosis and treatment. Finally, an endowment will be established at Columbia Dental Medicine to support airway disorder prevention and treatment for underserved persons.

We believe the documentary series, *Airway: The Battle to Breathe*, is destined to change millions of lives. It started as a simple story, six years ago in 2016. We began following a young woman's journey to find an answer to her unique health challenges. Sydney was a vibrant 20-year-old that seemed normal and typical, with no outward signs of problems. Yet when the cameras rolled, she described a pervasive exhaustion that was destroying her life.

At first, we thought Sydney Avis' problem might not be physical. The mysterious symptoms

she spoke about seemed almost imaginary. Driving home after that first interview, we said, "What have we gotten ourselves into?" Little did we know. This began our own journey documenting Sydney's search for real answers to a very real problem. Our cameras went with her to doctor after doctor, test after test, as she struggled to get an appropriate and complete diagnosis. We soon realized that the global healthcare system was bypassing or inadequately serving patients like Sydney.

Sydney's experience opened our door to a world of challenges and opportunity.

As producers we realized we had an explosive story on our hands. This was no longer a simple story. It was an epic about an epidemic. Too many people were undiagnosed, misdiagnosed, and untreated. We uncovered the vast divide between frontline clinicians and researchers. Most practicing professionals told us that what they knew about airway disorders they learned from a few forward-thinking mentors and their own clinical experiences.

Airway Disorders was not taught in their medical, dental, or professional schools and there was not enough current research to backup what they experienced in their practices. This really needed a Revolution.

In 2023, we expect to wrap up filming by capturing the diversity of the epidemic. No patient is the same. Each person has their own set of symptoms. We expect to capture the depth and breadth of this elusive and complex problem that has evaded the medical establishment for centuries.

The final documentary series will be shaped in post-production during the second half of 2023 and the early part of 2024. At this time all the material will be in the can, and we can determine the number of episodes and final story arc of the docuseries. We plan to air the series worldwide, with a distribution package that includes outlets like Amazon, Netflix, Hulu, PBS, Discovery, Apple, and others.
